**Purpose and Scope**

The limitations of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) as a single metric for assessing social cohesion, sustainability, and well-being are now widely acknowledged in contemporary debates. The challenge of developing and implementing socio-economic indicators that look beyond GDP is nowadays essential. The emphasis falls on the dynamic interplay between inequalities (in income, opportunity, and gender) and the quality of institutions (governance, corruption, trust, etc.). The session aims to serve as a convergence point for innovative research and invites theoretical and empirical contributions on (nonexhaustive) themes: new methodologies for measuring well-being; analysis of the interaction between institutions and inequalities; and the integration of Beyond GDP metrics into policy-making processes.
