**Purpose and Scope**

The accelerated growth of large cities in Latin America and the Global South has intensified socio-spatial segregation through unequal access to land, services and opportunities. This special session examines how social housing production and urban land markets shape segregation patterns in metropolitan and urban fringe areas. It builds on the hypothesis that high land values and real estate dynamics condition the location of social housing, frequently displacing it toward peripheral and poorly serviced territories. Contributions are invited that address social housing, land markets, public policy and spatial inequality from comparative and multiscalar perspectives. The session also encourages methodological discussions on measuring socio-spatial segregation.
